Answering the Call

Church has always been a part of my life. I grew up in a Christian home that made participating in the life of the church a top priority. My parents were involved in almost every area of lay involvement – Sunday school teachers, Royal Ambassadors, Girls in Action, Mission Friends, as well as the diaconate ministry. We attended Sunday morning, Sunday night, Wednesday night AND any other meeting including annual revivals.

Due to conflict in the church, we joined Tanglewood Church and continued to serve the Lord among that congregation.

Jo Anne and I both had a strong desire to do more to serve the Lord. She responded by enrolling as a student at Campbell University Divinity School in 1997. I followed her lead and began classes there in 1999. In June 2001 we answered the call to serve as the Pastor of Fremont Missionary Baptist Church in Fremont NC. We served together until Jo Anne passed away in Oct. 2004. I continued to serve in Fremont and remarried in May 2006.

What I saw in Sharon Rouse was a perfect example of grace, love, and mercy. I knew she was the perfect match for me. I thank God for her support and encouragement to me. We continued to serve in Fremont until Aug. 2017. After leaving Fremont, I taught 4th grade for 17 months while providing pulpit supply for Spilman as needed.

After being at Spilman for a several months, we knew this was the place we needed to move our membership to and plant our roots here. It has been a joy to serve the Lord through serving the people of Spilman. Over the past two years as Spilman's Interim Pastor, we have been through many difficult days together. We have lost our Pastor Dan Cromer and many key leaders due to death.

It has always been my desire to serve the Lord and His people in whatever capacity or opportunity that presents itself to me. I will be the first to admit I am not a perfect man. But I serve a perfect Savior, Jesus Christ. It is my desire to be found faithful to the task at hand. If the members of Spilman so choose, and if the Lord wills, I will attempt to live out my call to ministry among you to the best of my ability to serve as your next Pastor.


COVID-19 Update from Donna Keith, RN

I wish I could give you a positive update but we are very busy at UNC Lenoir. We are full in the COVID Unit and the Critical Care Unit. Everyday we have patients waiting for beds in our respiratory Emergency Room. Staff are out with COVID and those of us that are well are working extra. We are exhausted.

All of the long care facilities are experiencing an increase. Harmony Hall has had to send positive patients to Raleigh for care and quarantine because Raleigh has more beds than our hospital. This is extremely serious. Young and old alike are affected. This virus does not discriminate!

Please wear your mask, social distance, and wash your hands. You may be saving yourself and another person from being attacked by this virus. The chances are you will survive but you may have long term problems that we are seeing a lot of these days. We still have 1 to 2 deaths per week, which is too many. We ask for your prayers for our patients as well as our staff. This is very hard on the staff. Thank you for staying safe!!!
