How to Prepare a Sunday School Lesson – by B. W. Spilman

Spilman Memorial Baptist Church was named as a memorial to Bernard Washington Spilman (Jan. 22, 1871 – March 26, 1950). Many institutions have buildings named in his honor (Mars Hill University and Ridgecrest). Our church is in possession of some of his original photographs, sermons, papers, and books. (More of his items are kept in a special collection at Wake Forest University) Since Dr. Spilman was known as “Mr. Sunday School,” I thought it would be fitting to share one of his handwritten lessons on “How to Prepare a Sunday School Lesson.”

- I. Master the Facts
 - A. Read the Text (Many times, Prayerfully, Analyze)
 - B. Use the imagination
- II. Get the Context
 - A. Read what is before and after the text
 - B. Study Bible References (Harmony of the Gospels)
- III. Persons – History
- IV. Places – (Location and History)
- V. Interpret the Lesson Text (Words, Phrases, Manners and Customs)
- VI. Teachings (General knowledge of the Bible, Lesson Helps)
- VII. Illustrations (From the Bible and the World which is Jesus’ method)
- VIII. Lesson Plan
 - A. Select one (or a few) truths
 - B. Plan Three parts of the lesson
 1. Begin (Review, Lesson Story, A Striking Truth, Anything of immediate interest)
 2. Body of the Lesson
 3. Conclusion – Do not hold on (linger)

The Kingdom of God by Dr. H. Powell Dew, Jr.

In the *Lord of the Rings* books by J. R. R. Tolkien, we are introduced to the events in the “Kingdom of Middle Earth.” In this kingdom there are Elves, Men, Dwarves, Hobbits, Orcs, and Trolls. As the story unfolds, we see each of these are vying for control of the kingdom.

The dictionary defines kingdom as “a politically organized community or major territorial unit having a monarchical form of government headed by a king or queen.”

Any casual reader of world history knows there have been various kingdoms that have risen and fallen over the millennium. Some have lasted centuries, while others have only lasted a few brief years. In the Old Testament, the kingdom of Israel lasted for centuries but eventually crumbled in defeat in 70 A.D. at the hand of the Romans.

In Matthew 4:17 Jesus announces a new era had begun. “From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.” This is the same message that John the Baptist began to preach earlier in the wilderness, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.” (Matthew 3:2)

Jesus’ announcement is one that is challenging the current kingdom of this world. Satan has been described as the “prince of the power of the air.” (Ephesians 2:2) Satan still continues to exert his influence on the lives of people who are swept up in their sins of disobedience. Satan also has been described as the “ruler of this world.” (John 12:31). The kingdom of Satan continues to operate today seemingly unchecked and undefeated. Jesus promises us that “the ruler of this world will be cast out.” (John 12:31) We can take great comfort in knowing the kingdom of God will prevail.

When Jesus made this assertion in Matthew 4:17, He was literally standing right in front of them in the flesh. King Jesus was ushering in a new kingdom where He is Lord, Savior, Master, and Ruler of All.

The key to transitioning from a follower of the kingdom of the world and into the kingdom of God is to “REPENT.” It means to turn from following one set of principles and embrace another. It means to turn from your sins and embrace the forgiveness offered by the Savior who has the authority to forgive you of your sins. It means to turn from following Satan and begin aligning your life with the teachings of Jesus Christ.

God in His infinite wisdom, has given mankind the freedom to choose which kingdom they will follow.

With so much technology available to us today, it is so easy to become ensnared in the day-to-day events of the world. We are inundated with information about what our governmental leaders are doing, foreign politics, global catastrophic events, what celebrities are saying, what is happening in sports, the newest movie, and what all our “friends” on Facebook are doing. As we consume these “worldly” diets of information, it transforms our heart, mind, soul, and strength. It is as tempting as candy to a child, and as addicting as alcohol and drugs to an addict. As someone once said, “We are what we eat.”

Jesus is calling us from the “tumult of our lives wild, restless sea.” He is calling us to “love Him more” than the kingdom of this world. He is calling us to “love and serve Him best of all.”

This year I have made a concerted effort to keep my heart, mind, soul, and strength focused on the things of God. I have committed myself to spend more time in God’s word and nourish my soul with His message of redemption and salvation.

As we move into the next few months, I will be focusing on King Jesus in the Book of Matthew as the basis of our Sunday morning worship sermons. May you join me in keeping the kingdom of God at the center of our lives!



Worship Services at Spilman Memorial Baptist Church

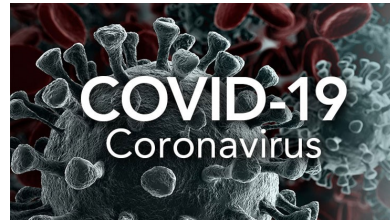
The church will continue with weekly mailings and Facebook Live on Sunday morning at 10:30.
