on the Sunday I was not preaching. It felt good to worship the Lord and not feel the pressure and stress of saying just the right thing in just the right way. That afternoon, I could feel all the stress of vacation travel, work and family responsibilities fade away. I decided the topic I wanted to discuss with my fellow Pastors on Tuesday was "Self-Care."

I was able to find a suggested list covering eight areas of self-care. (See the list on the back) This was the list that I shared with my fellow Pastors. We began to share the areas we each needed to focus on with more intentionality. Some of the hot-button topics included:

Learning to set boundaries within their ministry so they don't burn out.

Take time to read several different books covering different topics.

Turn off social media and computers and not allow them to take over their life.

Take time to declutter their home. One has begun systematically giving unwanted items to charity. Several confessed they rarely take their vacation time.

Many Pastors said they need to spend more time in prayer, and in the study of God's word – not just in preparation for the next sermon. They desired to grow in their walk with the Lord. One person acknowledged they need to be more intentional in taking everything back to the Lord in prayer.

One minister said he had started a part time job so it would allow him a doorway back into the community outside his church circles.

As I reflected upon our meeting, the thought came to me, "Pastors are People too!" They have the same stresses that everyone else has. So many people in church place their Pastor on a pedestal and have such high expectations of perfection that it is overwhelming to live in the fish bowl. The stress of living under the microscope can become oppressive. I am thankful that the Personnel Committee insisted I take some vacation time.


