

Canes, Walkers, and Wheelchairs

I remember growing up, our family would love going to the K&W Cafeteria. It was a special treat to go down the line and order our meat, vegetables, rolls, drink, and we may even split a piece of dessert. There was always someone at the end of the line to assist you if you were not able to navigate the tray by yourself. We have been to the K&W in Raleigh, Goldsboro, Wilson, and Greenville. I think Kinston had a similar cafeteria at the mall years ago. Today, there are only a few K&W's left, with most closing due to the covid pandemic.



I remember someone once said they named the restaurant "K&W" because all the DR. H. POWELL DEW, JR. people that went there had "Canes" and "Walkers." Looking around I could always see many people that came had canes, walkers, and wheelchairs. I think the attraction was the place offered a wide variety of food to provide for everyone's needs, the food was instantly ready, and the quality was consistent. The staff was pleasant and helpful to customers using canes, walkers, and wheelchairs.

Over the past few years, many people would call the church to see if we had a wheelchair or walker they could borrow. Thankfully, several families that no longer needed them had given them to the church and we have been able to help many individuals in this way.

I have learned there are seasons in our life when we have to adapt and change to our current situation. It could be a change in location due to a job change and now one needs to find a new house. It could be an addition to the family and a new larger vehicle is now needed. It could be the children have moved out of the house and it's now time to downsize. Or our physical health changes cause us to depend on items like grab bars in the bathroom, canes to help us stabilize as we move around or walkers and wheelchairs when we need them.

Ecclesiastes 12:6 admonishes us to, "Remember your Creator before the silver cord is loosed (spine/back), or the golden bowl is broken (brain/mind), or the pitcher shattered at the fountain (circulation of the blood/veins), or the wheel broken at the well (heart)."

We are called upon time and time in scripture to return back to the Lord before it is too late. When we are young, we think we are invincible – "ten feet tall and bullet proof." We may even feel the inevitable changes in life will not touch us. As we get older, we have a greater appreciation of how fragile life is and how short our time really is.
