



Emotionally Healthy Discipleship

Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me." (Matthew 16:24)

The call to follow Jesus has been issued to everyone. Some reject Jesus, while other people have only taken a shallow approach to following Jesus. But there are a few that have taken intentional steps in their lives to model their lives after Jesus. They seek to deny themselves – taken up the cross of obedience, the rejection of self, put the Kingdom of God first in their lives, and go wherever Jesus leads. This process of transformation is what has been commonly called discipleship. Becoming a genuine – thoroughly convinced – immersed – mature follower of Jesus.

Peter Scazzero in his book, *Emotionally Healthy Discipleship*, calls followers of Jesus to move from shallow Christianity to a deeper transformation in our daily walk with Jesus. Self-discovery and self-reflection are central to becoming an emotionally healthy disciple. There are often pitfalls that hinder our ability to move forward with any sense of satisfaction and fulfillment in answering Jesus' call on our lives.

Peter Scazzero identifies four failures that undermine our goal of becoming a healthy disciple. What are the beneath-the-surface failures that undermine deep discipleship and keep people from becoming spiritually mature?

Failure Number One – We Tolerate Emotional Immaturity. First, we no longer measure our love for God by the degree to which we love others. We are called to love others – period! Our love for others is a measure of how we love God. Secondly, we elevate the Spiritual and distrust the emotional. The five aspects of being human include: physical, spiritual, intellectual, social, and emotional. We do not need to ignore the emotional side of our life.

Failure Number Two – We Emphasize <u>Doing for God over Being with God.</u> We need to shift our thinking away from a works centered relationship with God (teaching, preaching, giving, doing) to a relationship centered walk with God (prayer, meditation, listening, reflecting, reading the Bible). The comparison between Mary and Martha clearly illustrates this. (Luke 10:39-42)

Failure Number Three – **We Ignore the Treasures of Church History.** We need to grasp the truth that we are one stream within the larger river of God. We are part of one global church with three branches. We also need to see each of these movements have their own dirty laundry and blind spots.

Failure Number Four – We Define Success Wrongly. It is so easy to get caught up in counting the numbers as success. We get caught up with the idea that larger is better. Success, according to scripture, is becoming the person God calls you to become, and doing what God calls you to do – in His way, and according to His timetable.

We will explore this topic in more detail in the coming months!
