Remembering the Limits of our Work—Mark #3

Peter Scazzro in his book *Emotionally Healthy Discipleship* has identified seven key concepts that help us mature as healthy disciples of Jesus Christ. In July we examined the first mark which was to "*Be before you Do*." Our formation as a child of God (Being) is critically important before we become swept away in the demands (doing) of ministry for God. Last month we examined the idea of following the "*Crucified Jesus instead of the Americanized version of Jesus*." This month we are focusing on the third mark of a disciple, "*Remembering the Limits of our Work*."

There are so many things that limit our ability to accomplish all we want to do. In the Bible we see there were limits in the Garden of Eden, limits on John the Baptist's ministry, and even Jesus had limits during His earthly ministry. We too have limits in our personality and temperament. Limits due to our current season in life. We may be limited emotionally and physically. We are all subject to the limits of time. Yet acknowledging our limits can actually free us to see how God is working around us in spite of what we are not able to do.

As a church, we too have limits and cannot do all the things we once did. The number of deacons has decreased due to the dwindling number able to serve like they once did. We are not able to do the thriving ministries Spilman once had. Many members are dealing with physical limitations and cannot participate like they once did. During our Long-Range planning meetings, we have acknowledged these limits and lamented our current situation.

It has been my prayer that the Lord would send laborers into the harvest to help accomplish His mission, in His city, in His community, through Spilman. I am very hopeful that our new partnership with the Collective Church, a new church plant in Kinston, will be able to accomplish the needed work of teaching others to obey what Jesus has taught, making disciples, and ministering to the Kinston community. Starting in September, we will begin opening some of our space to this church for ministry to children and ministry outreaches to our neighboring community. As the Collective Church and Spilman get to know each other over time, more opportunities for joint ventures will develop.

Peter Scazzro, in his book summarizes the short story, *Leaf by Niggle* which was written by J. R. R. Tolkien. He wrote this book at a time when he was coming to grips with his limits and the incompleteness of his work as a writer.

The story is about a man named Niggle, an artist, who has a passion to paint a beautiful landscape, a huge detailed scene centered around a magnificent tree. He spent a great deal of time focusing on the leaves on the tree and getting them "just right" that he never finished the tree before he died. (Continued on next page)
