#### The Love of God

Many individuals view God as unloving or uncaring. The scientist Isaac Newton thought that when God created the universe, He simply wound it up like a manual clock and then sat back and watched as the laws of nature unfolded and guided creation. If this is true, then God would appear to be unconcerned about our life's circumstances.

The Bible speaks of God as being outside of His creation, but is intimately involved in His creation. John 1:1,14 speaks of our God as one that is with us. "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, and the glory of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth." God came in the flesh to dwell among us. 
# Deacon of the Month Pat Moore February 2025
