Change is the Constant of Life

As I look back over my life, I recognize there was a time where the people and events were a consistent presence in my life. I attended the same school while we lived in Virginia through the 5th grade. We attended the same church EVERY Sunday. We lived in the same house, had the same neighbors, and everyone knew everyone else. My family was a stable and constant presence. On holidays we would alternate between visiting my father's family in Raeford and my mother's mother in North Wilkesboro. There was a rhythm and routine of life with little variation.

Our family moved to Raleigh when I was 12 years old. I attended a different school, a different church, made new friends, and learned the routines of life in a much larger city. Even though those routines changed, we never changed our routines of visiting family for special events and holidays.

Leaving for college was a natural progression and change in my life. There were challenges and obstacles to overcome, but the deep grounding my family provided me gave me the inspiration to complete what they had started. Over the years, I have experienced marriage (1984), the birth of our daughter (1988), the death of my grandfather (1994), enrolling in Campbell University Divinity School (1999), the death of my wife (2004), remarriage (2006), the death of my grandmother (2010), and the death of my father (2022). What I thought were the constants in my life eventually changed.

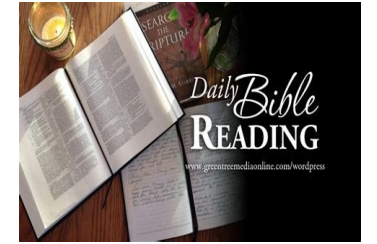
